Market Flavors

Zucchini Chocolate Cake

1 stick margarine
 1/2 c. vegetable oil
 1 1/2 c. sugar
 1 egg
 1 tsp. vanilla
 1/2 c. skim milk
 2 tsp. vinegar
 2 c. all-purpose flour
 1/2 c. whole wheat flour
 4 tbsp. cocoa powder
 2 tsp. baking soda
 2 c. shredded zucchini
 12 oz. chocolate chips



Cream first three ingredients with an electric mixer. Add egg, vanilla, milk and vinegar. Mix well until blended. Add flour, cocoa and baking soda. Mix well. Stir in zucchini. Pour batter into greased and floured (flour with cocoa for brown color) 9x13 inch pan. Sprinkle chocolate chips over top. Bake at 325 degrees for 45 to 50 minutes.
